

What Your Child Can Do About Bullying

From time to time parents have asked me what they should tell their child to do if they





are the victim of bullying. The following strategies/advice may assist you:

If you're being bullied...tell the person to stop

- use neutral language to respond to the bullying, like 'maybe' or 'that's what you think' and
- walk away
- try to act unimpressed.

But if it's been going on for a while and these don't work..

- talk to your friends and ask for support
- talk to your parents
- talk to a teacher

If you are cyberbullied...

- don't respond to the message or image
- save the evidence
- block and delete the sender
- report the situation to the website or Internet Service Provider
- tell trusted people friends, adults, teachers, parents and police if necessary.

Stage 1 Excursion

Students in classes 1L, 1/2B, 1/2C and 2S participated in an excursion to Centennial Parklands to consolidate the HSIE unit they have been studying, Wet and Dry Environments.



They spent almost 3 hours with Park Rangers who had them participate in activities in two different environments - terrestrial and aquatic.



Dip netting was fun as students scooped out water from the edge of a pond and analysed what was found. All groups found tiny little beetles which they transferred to small trays and identified from a chart. One group even found a baby shrimp!!




Walking through Lachlan Swamp, students had to listen to a story and collect items from the ground that a bird would build a nest with. Lachlan Swamp is also home to hundreds of bats! The smell wasn't very nice but it was great to see them hanging upside down, spreading their wings and flying from tree to tree.









There were so many birds in the Parklands, and as the students saw them, they marked them off on a chart. They found 11 birds in all, including the kookaburra, pelican and magpie.





The last fun activity for the day invloved constucting habitats for a variety of animals using materials they could find from the Parklands. It was great to see students working together to build a home for their animal.

Players Code

- Be a good sport

- Learn to value honest effort, skilled performance and improvement
- Wear appropriate safety equipment
- Wear full school sports uniform including a school hat

Parents Code

- Encourage participation by your children
- Provide a model of good sportsmanship for your child to copy
- Be courteous in your communication with players, team officials, game officials and sport administrators
- Encourage honest effort, skilled performance and team loyalty
- Do not interfere with the conduct of any event
- Ensure your child wears appropriate safety equipment
- Ensure your child is dressed in full school sports uniform including a school hat

Spectators Code

- Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour
- Remember children play for enjoyment. Don't let your behaviour detract from their enjoyment
- Let game officials conduct events without interference
- Support skilled performances and team play with generous applause
- Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters
- No alcohol
- No smoking
- No spectators behind plate markers
