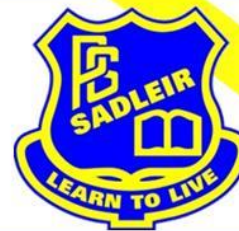

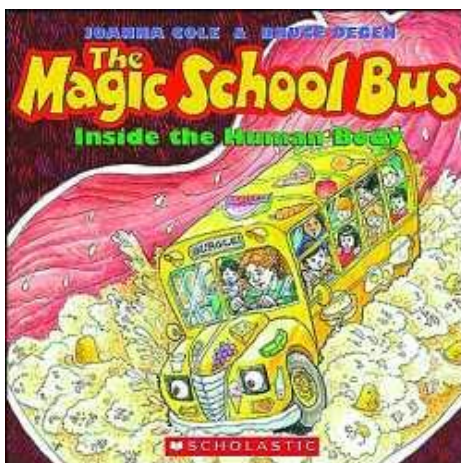

If you eat chilli food, your taste buds stop tasting. By Naeem Talukder



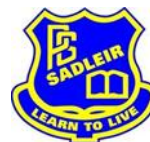
Playtime with GoGo at Sadleir
