News from the Office

LMBR - Learning Management Business Services

LMBR is coming to our school from Term 4. Mr Ralph, Miss James, Mrs Braun and myself have been attending training.

As a valued member of our school community, we wish to give you advance notice of changes to the procedures of our school and a group of NSW Public Schools over the coming months.

The NSW Department of Education is implementing a standardised system for all NSW Public Schools by the end of 2017. A total of 407 primary schools in the Bankstown, Botany Bay, Campbelltown, Canterbury, Georges River, Glenfield, Liverpool, Macarthur, Marrickville, Port Hacking, Port Jackson, South Coast, Strathfield, Wollondilly, Wollongong, Wollongong North & Woronora River Principals Networks are scheduled to commence using the new system on **17 October 2016**.

Our school policies and the way we collect money will not change but the way we process things will. Our school no longer holds a bank account as the Department of Education will hold all the money for the schools as they progress onto LMBR.

The main changes for you at this stage is:-

THERE WILL BE NO ONLINE PAYMENTS ALLOWED FROM FRIDAY 23rd September 2016 until we go live after 17th October 2016.

REFUNDS will no longer be given by cheque. They will be credited to your child's account and be able to be used for other things.

Any money held for camp and swimming scheme paid before the holidays is held in trust for those activities.

After we go live there will be a delay in the processing of payments to the school until we get the new system up and running. So if you make a payment, whilst you will get a receipt, it will be delayed. This will be mostly noticed with uniform purchases which will not be receipted until after 17th October.

We will be getting an EFTPOS machine to make paying for activities more convenient.

We ask your support and patience whilst the new procedures are being introduced.
