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Sadleir Public School Road Safety Program

It's been a busy start to the year with Sadleir Public School classes learning all about Road Safety.

The students have learnt how to be responsible pedestrians by holding a grown ups hand and to stop, look, listen and think when crossing the road.

They know there are different car seats to use in the car depending on their age and to always buckle up their seat belt (click, clack, front and back) when travelling in the car. They also learnt how to use the safety door. This is the door closest to the footpath.
