Principal Report

Design Your Future Project

Work has already begun to build Sydney's second international airport at a site in Badgerys Creek that is less than 20 kilometres from Liverpool. A talented group of stage 3 students are currently deeply engaged in a high level technology project. Liverpool City Council is offering a \$10,000 prize to the most inspirational design of the Aerotropolis created by primary school students using Minecraft. This innovative challenge is supported by Western Sydney University and Microsoft. What is an aerotropolis?

An aerotropolis is a metropolitan subregion whose infrastructure, land use and economy are centred on an airport. The Aerotropolis will be largely a walkable mini-city that will also use electric vehicles and ideally harness solar and wind power for its energy. Imagine an Apple or Google headquarters, but on a bigger scale

We thank Mr Bryant for joining us on this day. We would like to also thank all the students for showing respect during the service.

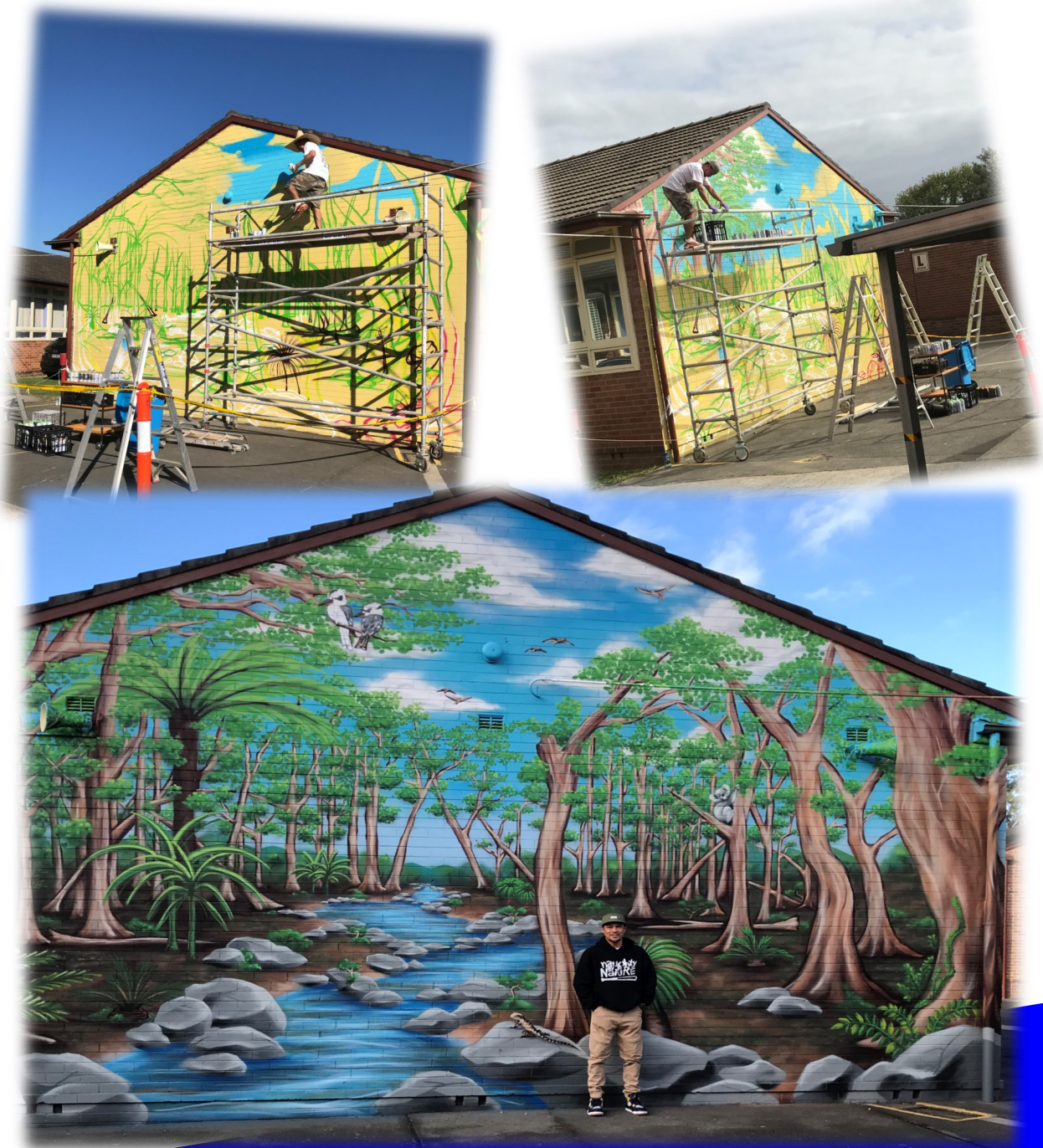


Sadleir Public School Mural

The project brings together 22 students to collaborate, design and construct Badgerys Creek Airport that is set to open in 2028. While working on the project, students will be integrating a number of key learning areas of the curriculum. Students will work on the futuristic Aerotropolis (Airport City) through their own creative thinking of a futuristic Liverpool, 2028 through collaboration with their peers.

The project was inspired and set by our local Liverpool City Council who put forward the idea and decided to include a corresponding competition. We believe the project/competition is relevant, as these students will be finishing high school or undertaking further studies in or around the completion of the airport.

We look forward to exploring and showcasing our students work in coming weeks, and wish our students the best of luck in the competition.

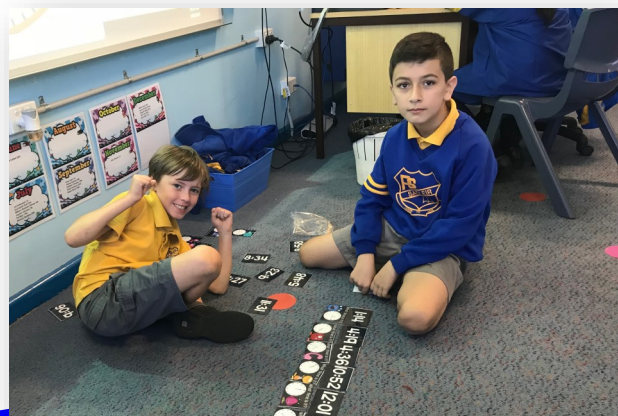


WHAT HAS 3-4 AQUA BEEN UP TO?

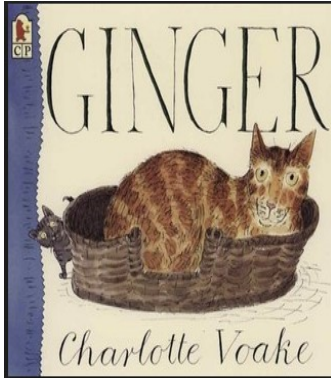

Booktalk!

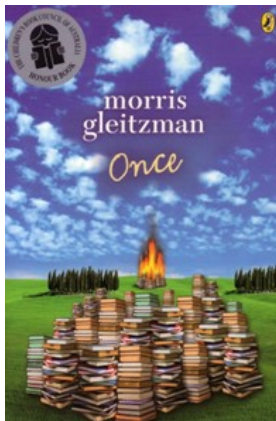


Ginger by Charlotte Voake

Once by Morris Gleitzman

This book is the first book in a series about a Polish Jewish boy who endeavours to find friendship in the most unfriendly environment, being Germany in World War II. Through the eyes of Felix, a ten year boy, it follows his journey trying to understand human behaviour during the war, both good and terrible. The author cleverly used his extensive research of history, through diaries, letters, notes and memories of people who were young at the time of the war, to make the strong connections between his characters and history.

I would recommend this book and his other books from the series (*Then*, *Now*, *After*, *Soon* and *Maybe*) to students in Stage 3 as it explores point of view and empathy towards others.

A word of caution, you will need some tissues when reading any of the books from this series.
