Bookweek

This year's Bookweek activities were a great success with children and staff having a great time dressing up as book characters. A big thanks to all parents who came along to the events. Hundreds of books were purchased at the book fair. Special thanks to Miss Malone for organising the week and ensuring that our library has a great range of new titles for students K-6 to read.

Preschool

Sadleir Public School has one of 100 government preschools offering programs for children the year before Kindergarten. Miss Dixon and Mrs Foat are early childhood trained educators. They plan and implement programs to nurture a child's self esteem, wellbeing and development.

The preschool program is designed to stimulate children's skills in:

- thinking
- communicating
- investigating
- Exploring
- problem-solving

Children are encouraged to join in physical activities and develop good health and safety habits. Programs include play-based activities that help children learn how to interact positively with other children and to recognise and accept their own feelings and those of others. They also develop early language, literacy and numeracy skills.

Our preschool operates during school hours (9:00am – 3:00pm). Enrolments for 2020 are now open.

Preschool Playground Update

You may have noticed that the preschool playground has been closed for some weeks. Unfortunately we were not satisfied with the quality of recent improvement works. The department is working with the contractor the rectify the issues as soon as possible.

Afternoons at the back gate

Approximately 40% of students leave via the back gate every afternoon. After lengthy negotiations the council have acted to improve road safety by removing the truck parking area, installing a wombat crossing and turning Quadrat Lane into a one way street. A teacher assists the safe exit of children every afternoon. One of their roles is to ensure no child remains at the gate after 3:15pm. During this time, early learning centres, schools, libraries, booksellers, authors, illustrators and children celebrate Australian children's literature. It is an annual celebration that encourages children to connect with books and reading on a fun, personal level. Numerous studies have shown that reading books to and with children deepens your bond, while also fostering a love of learning and reading books for pleasure. If a child sees a loved one enjoying books, they're more likely to associate books with enjoyment. We believe that Book Week is truly a special time. The week-long celebration of literature sends a powerful message to children—and adults—across Australia; reading is vitally important and books are worthy of being cherished.

This year the Children's Book Council of Australia Book Week theme is "reading is my <u>secret</u> power". Stories are powerful. It is normal for children to behave in ways that are challenging for their parents. How children are feeling affects the way they behave. As they grow up children learn what good behaviour is and how to control problem behaviour through their interactions with their parents and those around them. However, at times this can be hard for parents to manage.

This session aims to promote positive parenting through behaviour guidance and reduce the stress associated with raising young children aged 0-5 years.

Topics include

- Understanding some of the causes of challenging behaviour
- Skills to help you manage your child's behaviour including rules and basic behaviour management strategies
- What behaviour is normal
- Understanding the behaviour escalation cycle
- Understanding what may be maintaining challenging behaviour

<u>PSSA Newcombeball</u> <u>Season Wrap up</u>




