This is not appropriate and must not happen.

New Gates

We have installed new electronic gates on the driveway and front pedestrian entrance. The gates have increased security and eliminate the need to open the gate manually using the old bolt lock. We are exploring options to increase access for people with prams and or wheelchairs.



Get Lost Mr Scary is an anxiety program that helps young children develop skills to cope with fears and worries. This experiential play-based program incorporates cognitive-behavioural and narrative elements.


Our parent workshop focused on what anxiety is, strategies to assist your child, and details about the **Get Lost Mr Scary** program.

Types of Anxiety

The program addresses the types of anxiety commonly found in children aged 5 to 7 years

Mrs Shashati's Rice Croquettes



"My favourite Italian restaurant is my Nona's house. She taught me how to make these when I was young and now they are my children's favourite!"



Ingredients:

- 2 cups medium grain rice – unwashed
- 2 eggs
- Parsley – finely chopped
- Parmesan cheese – grated
- 2 cloves of garlic – finely chopped
- Salt to taste
- 2 egg whites/oil to seal



Directions:

1. Salt the rice water and cook – either on stove top or microwave
 2. Allow rice to fully cool down
 3. Add parsley, garlic, cheese and combine
 4. Taste for salt and add if necessary
 5. Add 2 eggs and combine
 6. Prep 2 egg whites or oil and prepare to fry
 7. Heat Rice Bran oil or Vegetable oil in shallow frypan
 8. Roll mixture between hand in either ball, roll or oval shape and pat with egg whites or oil
 9. Add to pan oil (when hot) and fry till light golden
 10. Remove and drain on serviettes
- Plate and serve!


