
In English, we developed our own story texts based on Circle. We used a circular story map to plan our writing and created texts about our chosen animals.




Finally, we used the Book Creator app on the iPads to bring all the elements together to create digital picture books.

We really enjoyed the process of creating our e-books and hope you enjoy reading them. They will be on display in the front office.








Shark Swims

Students in 4 Ruby have been learning about how and why places are similar and different. They have been researching Australia's neighbouring countries e.g Fiji, Indonesia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands and Timor-Leste and comparing the diverse characteristics within these places to Australia.

3-6 Yellow have learnt how to tell Aboriginal stories and identify star constellations through Aboriginal String Theory. They have learnt to create the star Sirius, the constellation Orion and Haydes. They can use a star, canoe and 2 pronged spear in an Aboriginal story. They also learnt the story of The Seven Sisters which is a story about the stars of the Milky Way.

In Term 4 students have participated in a sports program run by Dance Fever. In this program 3-6 yellow have learnt a new set of sport skills each week, Hockey, Soccer, Football and Basketball.







Science is a favourite topic



in our class, especially when we get the chance to experiment with different things to see how they work. In these photos you can see students experimenting with potential and kinetic energy with their elastic band powered boats. Solving problems using magnets, exploring the effect of friction on force and motion. Creating circuits and using heat to cook honeycomb.

Using Robotics technology students had to navigate an obstacle course and determine how to program their Bee Bot to cross the room without stopping.



Silly Scientist Visit - K-2

This semester we have been learning about our Physical World. We have completed experiments to test changes in materials, looked at energy and forces and made toys from different materials. We discussed why certain materials are used and how we might make improvements to existing toys. On Monday 7 December our students in Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two were visited by the Silly Scientist to help us consolidate our learning! He invited some of our students up on to the stage and turned them into scientists. The Silly Scientist and his helpers showed us what happens when chemicals combine, how to make a bottle rocket and all about soundwaves and vibrations. We also sang some funny songs that had us all laughing. It was a great incursion and we all enjoyed the fun learning experiences.









In Week 8, on Thursday 3rd and Friday 4th of December Sadleir Public School celebrated our 2020 Gold Award recipients with a K-2 and 3-6 'Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) Gold Party'. To reward our student's consistent and exemplary behaviour during this academic year two incursions were organised to celebrate their achievements.

As part of our whole school community values program, Kindergarten to Year 2 enjoyed three rotations; messy play with the 'Mess it Up' company, water play and mini sports. Years 3 to Years 6, participated in two rotations; laser tag on the back playground and played in the 'Ultimate Gaming Trailer'.

This was evident in their improved speed in completing these puzzles, as well as, their collaboration and problem solving skills.







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
