NAIDOC Week Wellbeing Workshops

Today Souths Cares presented wellbeing sessions to our senior students. These sessions are part of our NAIDOC Week program. South Cares includes a group of young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leaders. Our students enjoyed playing to challenging games and meeting the team.

Transition to Kindy and High School

These transition points are important milestones in the lives of our young people. All our local high schools will be running transition and orientation events but most will be online. Dates have been set and all Year 6 students will be invited to participate. Sadleir's Kindy Orientation will now take place on site with 1 parent able to attend the outdoor venue. Parents will be invited to attend at specific times and specific dates to maximise health safety. We are expecting 46 students next year. This is the largest group since 2017.

Students in the Support classes have just finished a unit of work on fairy tales and had a great time designing and building baby and Father bear new chairs!









2Gold


















3/4 Jade

Your guide to driving and parking safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school. That's why you need to take extra care in 40km/h school zones.

- Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate.
 Parking signs are planned with children's safety in mind.
- Slow down to 40km/h in the school zone and stay aware of crossings.
- · Always park and turn legally around the school.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous.
- Never park in a bus zone or in the school bus bay.
- . Make sure your children use the Safety Door (rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor.
- Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child they will learn from you.

Remember to always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways. Don't park across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park. It's always a good idea to use the drop off and pick up area suggested by your school. This will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.
