Principal Report

Dear Parents and Carers

This week we commenced a major attendance project with a group of schools in the Liverpool area. The 'Every School Day Counts' project focuses on the importance of coming to school every day. A student who has 1 day off a fortnight (90% attendance) will miss 4 weeks of schooling by the end of the year. That is likely to have a negative impact on learning and progress. We have noticed that during wet weather and on hot days our attendance drops significantly. All our classrooms are air conditioned and students stay inside during wet weather and extreme heat.

As mentioned previously our school has received significant funds to run a tutoring program for students. This program is designed to provide intensive support to catch up any lost learning due to the 2020 Covid 19 disruptions. A group of stage 2 and 3 students are currently attending sessions 3 times a week. Year 6 students will be offered after school tutoring from the beginning of Term 2 and the support unit and K-2 program will begin later in the year. Mr Engesser has joined the tutoring team to provide additional expertise. Please contact me at school if you would like additional information.

Last week over 20 parents attended our first 2021 P&C

meeting. It was fantastic to have everyone back on site and I look forward to working closely with the P&C this year.

3 Sapphire



In 3 Sapphire, students have been learning to give each other constructive feedback! They have done this through the use of technology and giving verbal feedback. Students are learning to selfassess their work and reflect on theirs and others' learning. 3 Sapphire are beginning to use Seesaw to upload photos of their learning. They scan QR codes that are placed around the room and navigate to the Class Journal which shows all their work!



In Maths, 3 Sapphire are participating in hands-on lessons, using a variety of resources to solve number problems. Students have used dice and cards to create 3, 4 and 5-digit numbers and ordered them in ascending and descending order. These are also uploaded onto our Seesaw journal! We can't wait to see our Journal grow!





Over the last two weeks students in K-6 Peach have been busy working, building and creating. Writing and sharing stories about what we have made. We have had Reverse Garbage visit us and tell us about recycling and reusing, attended the Boating incursion and used all different materials to build simple structures that are tall, small and go over other things.


Library Lessons with Miss Malone
