1/2 Mauve

In Term I we enjoyed an excursion to the Wollongong Science Centre. Students in 1/2 Mauve enjoyed a "Bubbleology" show and were able to complete a STEM chalenge, using a range of materials to create a boat that floats. We were then able to explore the exhibitions, looking at elements of sound, light and movement.





Our students are enjoying literacy rotations. We practise spelling, learn phonics, develop vocabulary, and read and write during this time.



During Science we explored living things. One of our favourite activities was to use iPads to take photos of living things in our school environment.















4/5 Indigo have begun taking part in activities through the Athletics Program run by Sportspro. We have been learning skills around relays and shot put for the last couple of weeks and have keenly engaged in all aspects of the program. We are looking forward to the rest of term 2 lessons and applying these skills to our athletics carnival!



3-6 Emerald

Students in 3-6 Emerald have been exploring how artists represent real and imagined concepts, as part of our integrated unit investigating Space and Earth.

In Visual Arts we looked at Van Gogh's painting The Starry Night and looked at different techniques he used to create the illusion of

> Earth's rotation to show his perception of the Moon and stars.

Students then used oil pastels to create their own night time landscapes using a

variety of blending and stippling techniques.

We then looked at the work of a living Australian

artist, Lindy Lee, and

explored her installation Moonlight Deities. In her work she showcases the patterns and phases of the Moon and how shadows are created. As a class we

worked collaboratively to create a moonscape installation, which we then

used to create different shadow and light effects.

Students explored using different coloured cellophane over studio lights to create various

effects and took photographs as their final art work. Some

DID YOU KNOW...

When we plant marigold flowers



throughout our garden, the scent tends to confuse flying insects which keeps them off our vegetables. They repel whitefly and soil nemotodes off tomatoes, flies off carrots and spiders and beetles off beans.
