In 6 Magenta this term we are learning about Drama in Creative Arts. Students use movement, voice and the elements of drama to sustain dramatic roles in a range of contexts. They devise and perform a range of drama forms for audiences.



Students are developing skills in playwriting, roleplaying and other situations. They are exploring dramatic forms such as improvising, movement, storytelling and video drama.

Students have formed groups of 4 to make a short film containing an original storyline and showcasing their writing, directing and acting ability. Groups will also gain experience in filmmaking and editing.





At the end of the term we plan to showcase the wonderful work students have done with a film festival. We will sit down and enjoy the films, eating some popcorn and a prize will go to the top group.





Last week Ranger Jamie came to visit the Support Unit here at Sadleir. We learned about water pollution and what human products are harmful to our ocean. The students were able to put some sunscreen and some oil onto their hands and then dip them into water to see if it dissolved.

We discovered that sunscreen does pollute the water if you go straight into the water. You need to wait 15 minutes after applying sunscreen, before you enter the water. We also learned that oil and water don't mix at all and that it is best to put your cooking oil into your garden. We also had a look at some Australian animals.


