Dear Parents and Carers

Sincere thanks for the great work that you are doing to support your child's learning. We are seeing some great engagement in online learning with some fantastic photos and work samples appearing in Google classrooms and SeeSaw platforms. Our teachers have been very impressed with the resilience of the students in this difficult and extraordinary time. Today I saw some preschool photos of students doing a wide range of fun activities and some great short films based on the weekly physical education challenges.

Reading is probably the most important learning activity that you can support at the moment. It would be very helpful if you, or an older brother or sister could read to and/or listen to younger children read once a day. This will help your child to keep their reading skills from becoming rusty. We can arrange delivery of additional reading books if required.

Thank you for your communication with teachers and please remember if your child has any issues you can contact the teacher so that we can fix the problem. Mr Tran is able to remotely solve many issues and we have additional devices including internet dongles available for delivery. Students will continue to receive paper packs to support off line learning. If you require some additional support or have specific questions please contact the school on 96078201. The message will be relayed to myself (Mr Ralph) or Mrs Carruthers and we will be in contact as soon as possible. Mrs Shashati our Community Liaison Officer has been working with the P&C to provide additional support. She can also be contacted on 96078201.

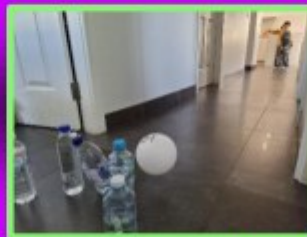
English

We have been reading and writing about Australian Animals this Term, using information and vocabulary to write reports. We have also been doing spelling and phonics every morning.



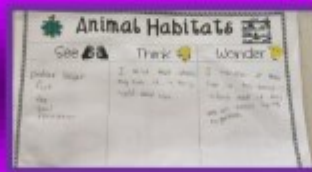
Creative Arts

We have been learning about reading and recording data as well as three-dimensional objects and their properties.



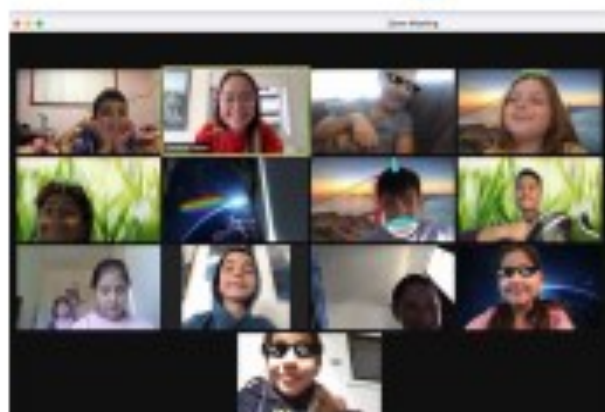

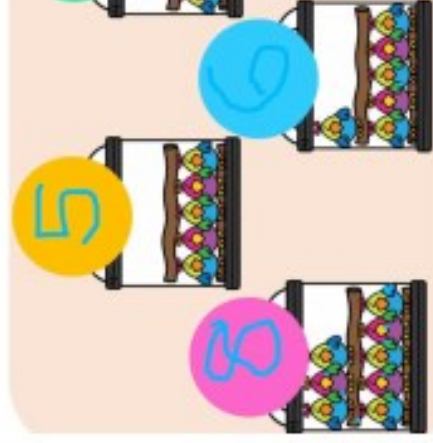
