Dear Parents and Carers

I've included some important information about attendance below.

#### Attendance and Absences

Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

# **Action Plans**

#### Dear Parents,

To ensure we meet all needs of our Students at Sadleir Public School it is very important that we have the most current health information on your child.

If your child has a health condition that requires ongoing management, it is very important the school is aware and is provided with the appropriate health management information.

If your child has any of the below conditions:

- \* Allergic Reaction
- \* Anaphylaxis
- \* Asthma

Individual Actions Plans for the above health conditions are mandatory and must be supplied by the students parent or caregiver to the school.

The plans must be developed, signed by your doctor, printed in colour and provided to the school via the front office every 12-18 months.

Your child's Individual Action Plan provides the school with crucial and current clinical information and key actions that will allow the school to provide your child with appropriate health care needed.
