Premier's Reading Challenge

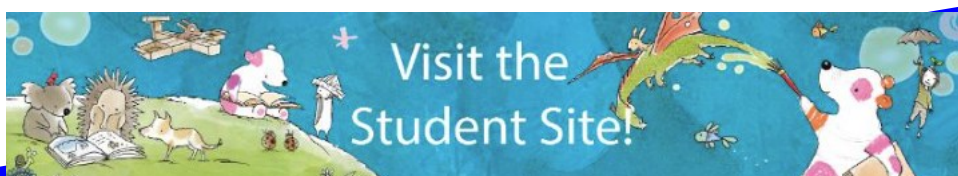

What's On in the Library in Term 3!

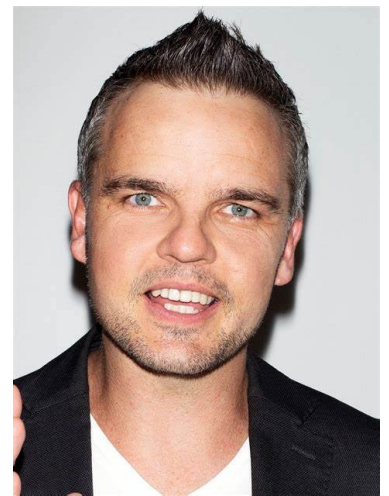
BOOK WEEK WEEK 5, TERM 3

PARENT EXCURSION



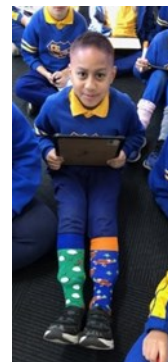
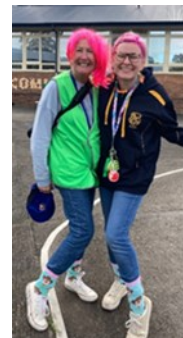
