In extreme circumstances and where behaviour is inappropriate the Inclosed Lands Protection Act may be applied.

From the Office

We are now taking enrolments for 2024!

If your child turns 5 on or before the 31st of July 2024 you can enrol them into **Kindergarten** for 2024. The Education Act 1990 mandates that all children must be in compulsory schooling by 6 years of age. If your child turns 4 on or before the 31st of July 2024 you can enrol them into **Preschool** for 2024.

The department is committed to providing high quality education to all students enrolled in NSW government schools. The department makes reasonable adjustments so students with disability can apply for enrolment on the same basis as students without a disability.

In enrolling a student, the department determines if there is a need to provide additional support for the student, including assessment of:

- health, safety, and other risks arising from the student's past behaviour
- any disclosed wellbeing needs of the student
- any adjustments for students with a disability
- any history of <u>unsatisfactory attendance</u> (when the student has been enrolled in another school)
- any disclosed health needs including whether or not the student has previously required an emergency response

• any disclosed learning needs and other special circumstances (such as whether the student was bullied at a previous school).
