#### Gala Day

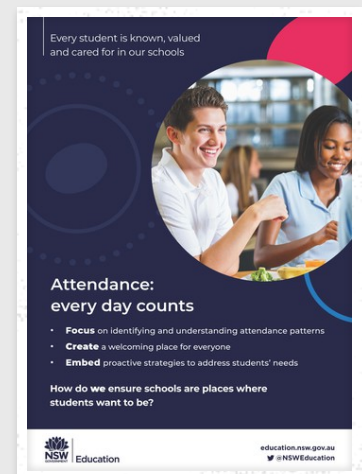

## FROM THE CLASSROOMS

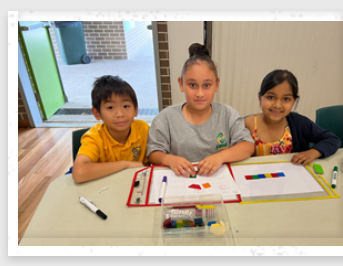
### STAGE 2

length and mass using formal units. Mr Tran is continuing his lessons on Earth and Space. We are looking forward to another interesting and busy term.





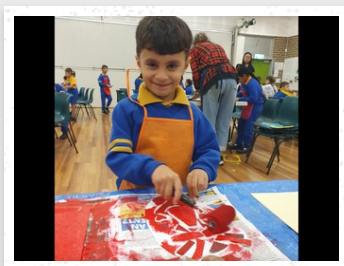


## STAGE 1

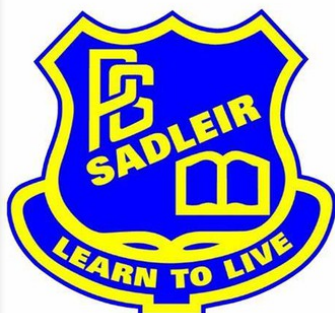
