Dear parents, guardians and carers,

**Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)**

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the *Disability Standards for Education 2005*, in line with the *NCCD guidelines (2019)*.

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. ## From the Office

### Uniforms

If you have any old school uniforms at home that are still in good condition, please bring them into the school office to be used as spare uniforms. Also, if your child has been sent home in spare clothes please wash and return them to the school office as soon as possible.

### We are now taking enrolments for 2024!

If your child turns 5 on or before the 31st of July 2024 you can enroll them into **Kindergarten** for 2024. The Education Act 1990 mandates that all children must be in compulsory schooling by 6 years of age. If your child turns 4 on or before the 31st of July 2024 you can enroll them into **Preschool** for 2024.

The department is committed to providing high quality education to all students enrolled in NSW government schools. The department makes reasonable adjustments so students with disability can apply for enrolment on the same basis as students without a disability.

In enrolling a student, the department determines if there is a need to provide additional support for the student, including assessment of:

- health, safety, and other risks arising from the student's past behaviour
- any disclosed wellbeing needs of the student



- any adjustments for students with a disability
- any history of [unsatisfactory attendance](#) (when the student has been enrolled in another school)
- any disclosed health needs including whether or not the student has previously required an emergency response
- any disclosed learning needs and other special circumstances (such as whether the student was bullied at a previous school).

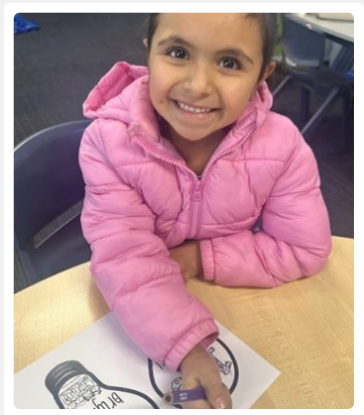

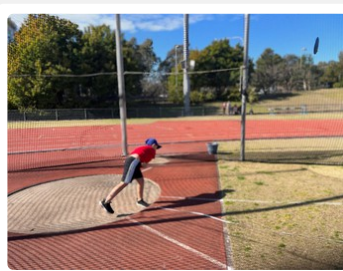






## Athletics Carnival

The community came together to witness an impressive display of athletic talent as participants competed fiercely in various captivating track and field events. It was a day that celebrated individual achievements and the spirit of unity and support that binds our school community together.





## Stage 3 Camp - Canberra

### Day 1

Stage 3 students left Sadleir Public School at 6:00am and arrived roughly at 10:30am. Our first tour for the day was at the National Australian War Memorial, arriving there at around 11am. At the War Memorial, we learnt that there are over 160,000 names on the wall of names. In the Hall of Memory, there is an unidentified soldier buried, there were several unidentified soldiers, so the memorial buried one soldier to represent all of the other unknown soldiers who were killed in the ANZAC War.

We then split into groups of two, and explored the Old Parliament House, which is currently 96 years old. At the Old Parliament House, we wore special porcelain gloves. The purpose of these was to keep the furniture clean and tidy. For the second half of the day we took a trip to the National Museum of Art and went to the New Parliament House (35 years old). All of these activities spiked the students' interest in what happens in these areas. In the Museum, we saw artists like Albert Namitjira, Sidney Nolan and many more famous artists who we have both recreated or studied in class. We even saw the Jackson Pollock artwork that is worth 1 million dollars.

After settling into our rooms and having dinner. We visited our last activity for day 1, which was Questacon, the National Science and Technology Centre. We went to Questacon at night at roughly 7:30pm to 9:30pm. This was probably one of our favourite places to visit, where we experienced the drop, caged lightning and felt the simulation of an earthquake. We were even able to buy science related things like gear cubes, putty, pin art and many more interesting things. After such an eventful day, we finally returned back to the sundown villa to rest for our next adventure filled day.



## Day 2

After breakfast, our first event for the day was at the Institute of Sport, which was action packed and we were able to have fun at playing a whole range of olympic and sport games. Following this, we went to the Royal Australian Mint, where we learnt that notes are printed all the way in Melbourne. "Coins are minted, notes are printed." is a sentence we remember our tour guide sharing. The cool thing is that we were able to see the process of minting coins and learned that we could mint our own coins, and even better, they are only obtainable in 2023!

Following this activity, we went to the Governor General's House which is only accessible to be seen by schools. Quick fun fact, the General's full title is "His Excellency the Honourable David John Hurley, Principal Companion and Chancellor of the Order of Australia, Distinguished Service Cross, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia". The Government house is the official residence of His Excellency, David Hurley. This place of residence was originally 1035 hectares in size and is now 16,000 hectares which can fit 40,000 sheep. His Excellency's residence was originally a farmhouse built in the 1830's. The land that the government house currently stands on is the land of Ngunnawal peoples.

Our last tour for the day was the National Museum of Australia, which featured a number of interactive exhibits and artefacts from the past. For the last few hours of activities we went to the Zone 3 Laser Tag and Arcade. We were able to play three rounds of laser tag and three rounds of any arcade games we wanted like DDR (Dance! Dance! Revolution), shooter games, Pac-Man and many others! It was such a great activity to end our day on. We then had dinner and some downtime in our rooms before lights out.

## Day 3

Day 3 was the final day of camp. We packed our bags and luggages then headed on the bus to Corin Forest Resort, which was the only activity for that day. It was great to see the snow where we had a snowman competition, played with snow and had a blast overall there. We ended our trip to Canberra with Mcdonalds and then went on our way back to school arriving back on record time. What a great adventure we all had together and many cool memories were made.

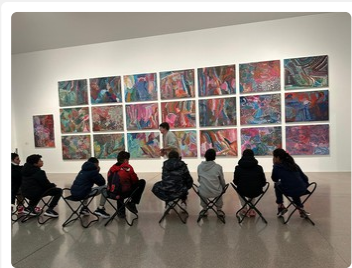

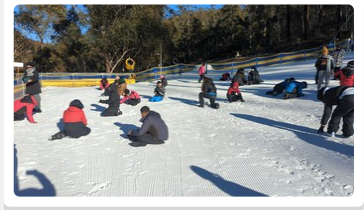

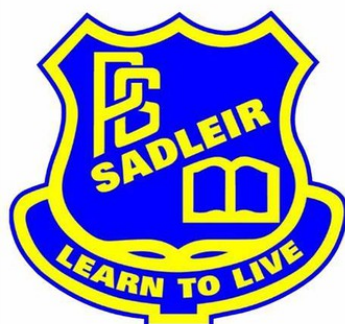
