
From the Classrooms

Stage 2

Stage 2 have been studying a short novel, 'Fantastic Mr. Fox" by Roald Dahl. They have been engaging in reading and writing activities around the text as well as being given opportunities to improve reading skills through guided, shared and independent reading activities. We are using the new English syllabus to increase skills, knowledge and understanding of English through the explicit and systematic teaching of writing skills, grammar, sentence structure, punctuation and spelling.



In Mathematics Stage 2 have been completing work from the new syllabus. We have studied whole number and addition and subtraction this term. We have completed a lot of practical number activities as required by the syllabus and used equipment and applied known strategies to solve problems. All lessons incorporate a working mathematically component and we are enjoying completing our learning in this area.



Stage 3 students are using visual arts and embodying different perspectives to create narrative and persuasive texts. Students explore how camera angles, language and imagery are used to sway emotions and capture attention. Through this process, they learn the art of weaving words together to convey a message and connect with their readers. As they continue to experiment with language and art, students strengthen their communication skills and discover the impact of language and imagery in evoking strong emotional responses.

Antibullying Commitment

Sadleir Public School is committed to doing everything we can to ensure our students feel safe at school and are given strategies to deal with bullying behaviour. Throughout the year, every class teacher will be teaching multiple units that empower students not only to stand up for themselves but also to be 'upstanders' for their peers.



The nationally agreed definition of bullying which all Australian schools now use:

- Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.
- Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records).
- Bullying of any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders. Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying.

Our interventions and events throughout the year will include;

- National Day of Action Against Bullying held in August.
- Zanna and the Lost Code performance Years 2-6 a cyber safety and resilience program.
- Bully Zero programs and workshops.

We are committed to working closely with the whole community to work towards making our school a bully free zone. Look at our Antibullying Plan on the school website and if you have any questions, we invite you to chat with someone at school.






Library News


Parking and traffic rules in school zones

You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk.

The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. Please choose safety over convenience.

ONE	WHAT DOES IT MEAN?	WHY IS IT THERE?	PENALTY	DEMERIT POINTS
NO PPPING	You cannot stop in a NO STOPPING zone for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space).	Keeps clear sight lines between drivers and children / pedestrians.	\$349	(School Zone)
)	You can stop in a NO PARKING zone for a max, of two minutes to drop off and pick up passengers. If no spaces are available you cannot goese on the road way or in any other zones while waiting for a space. You will need to drive away and park elsewhere, only returning when there is space to pull up. You must stay within 3 metres of your wehicle at all times and cannot leave your vehicle unattended.	Provides a safe place for children / pedestrian set down and pick up.	\$194 (3)	(School Zone)
S IE	You must not stop or park in a BUS ZONE for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space) unless you are driving a bus. If times are shown on the sign, you are not allowed to stop during those times.	Provides a safe place for large buses to set down and pick up school children.	\$349	(School Zone)
	You must not stop on or within 20 metres before a PEDESTRIAN CROSSING or 10 metres after a crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking.	So drivers can clearly see pedestrians on the crossing.	\$464 (3)	(School Zone)
	DOUBLE PARKING You must not stop on the road adjacent to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers.	Double parking blocks visibility and forces other cars to go around you.	\$349	(School Zone)
92	You must not stop on any FOOTPATH or NATURE STRIP, or even a DRIVEWAY crossing a footpath or nature strip for any reason.	You could easily run over a child or force pedestrians onto the road to get around you.	\$194	(School Zone)

Demerit Points:

- * The **Demerit Points** Scheme is a national program that allocates penalty points (demerits) for a range of driving offences. A driver who has not committed any offences has "**zero**" points. If you commit an offence that carries demerit points, the points are added to your driving record. If you incur the threshold number of demerit points within a three-year period, a licence suspension or refusal is applied. The three-year period is calculated between the dates the offences were committed. It ends on the day your most recent offence was committed.

You can help keep children safe by remembering the following:

- . drop off and pick up children on the school side of the road
- never call out to children from across the road it is very dangerous
- always take extra care when driving in 40km school zones follow all parking signs – these help keep children as safe as
- possible
- park responsibly even if this means you have to walk further to the school gate
- never double park it is illegal and puts children at risk
- never do a U-turn or three-point turn outside the school as it puts children at risk of harm
- model safe and considerate pedestrian and driver behaviours to your children.

- use a booster seat if they are aged between 4 and 7 years old - it's the law
- · are correctly buckled up in their seatbelts
- always get in and out of the car through the 'safety door' - the rear door on the footpath
- · are never left alone in the car.




